Marielle Scherrer-Crosbie, MD, PhD, FASE, Named the Recipient of the ASE/ASEF's Newly Diagnosed Severe Valvular Heart Disease Grant

ASE and the ASE Foundation are pleased to announce that **Marielle Scherrer-Crosbie**, **MD**, **PhD**, **FASE**, Professor of Medicine at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, is the recipient of the \$1.1M USD <u>Impact of</u>

Echocardiography Report Recommendations on Referral Patterns and Outcome in Patients with Severe Valvular Heart Disease (SVD) grant. The grant, which is awarded by ASE through the Foundation with funding support from Edwards Lifesciences, will examine the impact of embedded echocardiography report interventions on referral patterns and outcomes in patients newly diagnosed



with severe aortic stenosis (AS) by echocardiography. Congratulations to Dr. Scherrer-Crosbie and her team!

NEW Early-Career Development Grants Available for Echo Scientists - Apply Today!

ASE and the ASE Foundation are happy to announce a new funding opportunity available to early career scientists in cardiovascular imaging. The <u>Early-Career Development</u> <u>Grant for Echo Scientists (EDGES)</u> provides support and professional development opportunities for early career members in the Society and creates an avenue for the continued evolution of echocardiography through technical advancement and new applications.



The **program will award three grants worth up to \$25,000 USD** to fund projects that address a clinical gap in cardiovascular ultrasound imaging through research led by an early career scientist. There are no specific research themes that will be prioritized, and clinical gaps may include, but are not limited to: new imaging technologies, novel approaches or populations for diagnostic imaging, ultrasound therapy, workflow automation, or patient/practitioner safety. Physicians, PhDs, veterinarians, sonographers, and other healthcare professionals who are within seven years from having completed training are eligible to apply now through July 1, 2023, 5 PM ET. The principal investigator must be an active ASE member.
