Letter from the Chair

ello and Happy New Year! I hope your 2024 is off to a great start. This newsletter is bitter sweet for me because this is my final year as the ASE Foundation Board Chair. It has been an honor and a pleasure to serve the Foundation in this capacity since 2022. With this in mind, I reflected on what I envisioned for the Foundation when my term began. In my first newsletter, I expressed my hopes that the Foundation would expand its global outreach by encouraging international participation in education and research. I also wanted to attract participation in the Foundation's many activities from a broad section of ASE members. I think we have made strides towards achieving these goals, and I know we

can do more. This year, I look forward to creating opportunities for greater participation from the ASE membership as a whole and, particularly, our international partners.

Before I share what we have in store this year, let's take a look at our accomplishments from 2023:

- Awarded 72 Travel Grants & Scholarships to students, sonographers, and fellows.
- Raised \$86,871 for research funding from the 14th Annual Research Awards Gala.
- Hosted an in-person global health outreach event in Vietnam, scanning 852 adult and pediatric patients and training over 150 clinicians. You can read more about this event in the <u>December 2023</u> issue of Echo Magazine.
- Awarded the inaugural Gregory Tatum Global Health Travel Grant.
- Awarded \$75,000 with the inaugural Early-Career Development Grants for Echo-Scientists (EDGES).
- Raised a record-breaking \$38,083 for GivingTuesday.
- Surpassed our \$200,000 Annual Appeal goal, raising nearly \$250,000.

Thank you to the more than 1,900 people who donated in 2023. Your support empowers the Foundation to continue this great work in 2024.

This year, we plan to bring back a spring fundraiser to kick-start our annual appeal. In June, we'll be in Portland, OR, for the ASE Scientific Sessions. Stop by our booth where you can log your steps for the Cardiovascular Challenge, look at the beautiful photo exhibit that will be on display, and make a donation, of course! While in Portland, we will be hosting our premiere fundraising event, the 15th Annual Research Awards Gala, on Saturday, June 15. The theme follows the traditional wedding anniversary gift for 15 years: crystal. When planning what to wear, think shimmery, glitzy, glam. We hope to see you there. To wrap up the year, we will hold our popular fundraisers, Coffee Day at the end of September and GivingTuesday in early December. We hope you will join us for both, and better yet, tell your family, friends, and colleagues to support these fundraisers. As you know, it is you, our donors, that make us successful and we cannot do any of this without your support.





2023 EDGES Research Grants


ast year, ASE and the Foundation were thrilled to announce a new funding opportunity available to early career scientists in cardiovascular imaging. The Early-Career Development Grant for Echo Scientists (EDGES) provides support and professional development opportunities for early career members in the Society and creates an avenue for the continued evolution of echocardiography through technical advancement and new applications. The inaugural recipients of the Early-career Development Grants for Echo Scientists were Chieh-Ju Chao, MD; Son Duong, MD, PhD; and Xuan Ding, MD. Each was granted \$25,000 to fund their research addressing a clinical gap in


