

Are You Ready for the Affordable Care Act?


The Patient Protection and Affordable Care
Act's full affect on the healthcare system is
uncertain, but many newly insured patients
will bring with them the burden of years

Some practices are using lightweight portable echo systems to extend their expertise into underserved areas.


2013 Scientific Sessions Special Feature


