When you consider the fact that we had to cancel our single largest fundraising event, the annual Research Awards Gala, this figure is truly impressive! Even more impressive is the fact that the Foundation received donations from **2,820 donors**. This is almost 1,000 more donors than in 2019. Here are some other highlights from the past year:

- Established the first-ever separate ASE Foundation Board of Directors*.
- Raised money for our Australian sonographer colleagues in response to the Australia bushfire crisis.
- Began research collaboration for the World Alliance Societies of Echocardiography (WASE) COVID study.
- Had our first "virtual" global outreach event, partnering with the Vietnam National Heart Institute for the Virtual Vietnam National Congress of Cardiology meeting.
- Hosted a lecture and demonstration on 3D Imaging to sonographers based in India.

- Hosted a new "fun" draiser, the Holiday Karaoke Competition featuring talented members.
- Hit new fundraising records on GivingTuesday Now, Coffee Day, and GivingTuesday.
- Established the new Pamela S. Douglas, MD, FASE Research Scholar Award and Endowment Fund.
- Hosted a silent auction featuring virtual meetings with legendary ASE members.
- Awarded 55 training grants to students, sonographers, and fellows
- Distributed free copies of ASE's Stress Echocardiography Poster to over 7,000 people in the June printed version of JASE.
- Expanded our monthly sustainer club with new supporters.

I know we are looking forward to a brighter 2021, but it is important to remember all the accomplishments of the past year. I want to thank our incredible donors who made it all possible. I also want to thank my fellow Board members and Annual Appeal Committee members. Your dedication to the Foundation is inspiring.

*From 2003-2019 the Foundation had the same board of directors as the American Society of Echocardiography (ASE). ASEF remains a supporting organization of ASE, but with its growth in activities, the ASE Board voted to institute a separate governance structure. The new ASEF board members were installed in January 2020, with Dr. Vera Rigolin as the first chair of this separate board.



Australian Bushfire Fundraiser

Bushfires ravaged Australia during the unusually intense wildfire season of 2019-2020. ASEF leaders reached out to offer support and the Australasian Sonographers Association (ASA) gratefully accepted. They stated that sonographer incomes and work were severely affected by evacuations and shutdowns due



to the fires. To support our Australian members, the ASE Foundation set up a fundraising campaign to assist the ASA 2020 meeting with supporting conference attendance for people in bushfire affected areas. ASE members responded and we donated \$3,205 to the ASA. Thank you for showing #ASECares by supporting our colleagues in Australia.

COVID-19 RELIEF

On May 5, the ASE Foundation joined the GivingTuesday organization for GivingTuesday Now, a new day of giving created in response to COVID-19. We set a goal to raise \$5,000 to provide COVID-19 related support to our members. 33 generous donors contributed a total of \$5,125. Thank you to the anonymous donor who made an early pledge of \$250 to get us started and to Vera Rigolin, MD, FASE, Ritu Thamman, MD,

FASE, Raymond Stainback, MD, FASE, and the San Diego Echo Society, whose donations totaled \$1,800, and a very special thank you to Richard Stacey, MD, FASE, whose \$1,000 donation pushed us past \$5,000! With these funds we were able to grant \$100 scholarships to the 2020-2022 ASE Leadership Academy to help them cover cost of their application fees, and the remaining funds will cover CASE publication fees for COVID-19 related submissions. Three cases from around the world are already scheduled for publication in the February and April 2021 issues of CASE thanks to our donors' generous support.

Virtual Vietnam

As part of our global health outreach initiative. ASEF planned to host events in Vietnam and the West Indies in 2020. Due to COVID-19, these in person events were postponed but we explored opportunities for our volunteers to share their expertise virtually. Thanks to a collaboration with the Vietnam National Heart Institute, ASE Foundation outreach volunteers participated in the Virtual Vietnam National Congress of Cardiology in October. They presented lectures throughout the program, as well as a "POCUS in Daily Practice" training symposia for over 500 participants! Their lectures have also been made available on the congress' website to allow ongoing access for practitioners throughout Vietnam.





Team leader Dr. Jim Kirkpatrick said:

"Many thanks to our great ASEF team! We were able to pivot quickly in the face of travel restrictions to plan and execute a novel "virtual training village" and POCUS introduction, as well as provide prime-time lectures as part of the highly successful Vietnam National Congress of Cardiology. Our team reached large numbers of cardiovascular practitioners probably more than we would have during an in-person visit—and equipped them with nuanced knowledge to better serve patients. In particular, pioneering of the "virtual training village" may set the stage for future events in which ASE sonographers and physicians share their "tips and tricks" with cardiac ultrasound practitioners worldwide."

New Research Funding Opportunities in 2021


onations to the Foundation that are allocated to research allow us to support the progress and future of our field through investment in the discovery process and in the career of investigators. Research is a key aim of the Society and since 1975 over \$3 million has been given to support these activities. This year, the Foundation is pleased to offer two new research funding opportunities: the Pamela S. Douglas, MD, FASE Research Scholar Award and the Innovation in Cardiovascular Ultrasound Research Grants.

The Pamela S. Douglas, MD, FASE Research Scholar Award was established in honor of Dr. Pamela Douglas, ASE's thirteenth President (2001-2003) and a true pioneer in the field of clinical research. This award will support the future of echocardiographic research by granting

one-year (12 months) scholarships to support clinical or translational research scholars in advanced cardiovascular ultrasound research. One scholarship of \$75,000 USD will be awarded every alternate year. With the allocation of this support, young scholars will have protected time and the mentorship to pursue impactful research in cardiovascular ultrasound.

Application for the inaugural award closed February 1. The recipient will be notified March 1.

The Foundation will also offer two Innovation in Cardiovascular Ultrasound Research Grants of up to \$45,000 each for meritorious echocardiographic research proposals relevant to innovation in cardiovascular ultrasound. Of particular interest are proposals that expand the key role of echocardiography, or the development of novel technology, in



clinical diagnosis or management.
