Despite the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Foundation has persevered thanks to the unwavering support of our donors. It gives me such joy to share that because of you, the Foundation exceeded its 2021 Annual Appeal goal raising over \$241,000! We also saw record-breaking donor participation with over 3,300 individual supporters. I am very proud of all that we accomplished. Let's take a look at what we did last year:

- Raised over \$15,000 to provide COVID-19 support for two organizations in New Delhi, India.
- Collaborated with ASE to establish the Women In Echo member community.
- Participated in two virtual global health outreach events: Asian Society of Cardiovascular Imaging Congress and the Vietnam National Heart Association Congress, reaching over 6,400 clinicians.
- Hit new fundraising records for GivingTuesday raising \$35,529
 from 294 donors.
- Awarded \$165,000 in research grants.
- Distributed free copies of ASE's Role of Echocardiography in Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Guideline Poster to over 7,000 people in the October print version of JASE.
- Awarded 47 training grants to students, sonographers, and fellows.

I look forward to working with the volunteers and Foundation staff and am hopeful for a great year ahead. With the continued support of our donors, I know we will continue to make a world of difference.


2021 Giving Report

India COVID-19 Support

n just a little over one week in May 2021, 52 donors contributed \$15,267 towards a fundraiser to support the dire COVID-19 situation in India. ASE Past President Madhav Swaminathan identified two New Delhi organizations that would benefit from PPE supplies to which Duke Hospital donated a surplus of materials. ASE gave \$5,000 to support shipping the products to India and the additional \$15.267 in donated funds contributed to this effort as well. With the money raised, we were able to ship three pallets containing more than 12,000 pieces of PPE and medical grade disposables to New Delhi. Your donations brought much needed PPE to healthcare and community workers in India.



2021 Research Grants

upporting the future of echocardiography by investing in the discovery process and in the careers of investigators is an important objective of the Foundation. In 2021, we awarded \$165,000 in research funding which included two Cardiovascular Ultrasound Research Grants and the inaugural Pamela S. Douglas, MD, FASE Research Scholar Award. Olivier Villemain, MD, PhD, from the Hospital for Sick Children, University of Toronto and Bethel Woldu, MD, MPH, from Medstar Heart and Vascular Institute each received \$45,000 Cardiovascular Ultrasound Research Grants for their respective research proposals. Yasufumi Nacata. MD, PhD, from Massachusetts General Hospital was awarded the Pamela S. Douglas, MD, FASE Research Scholar Award. Upon receiving the award,



Remembering David J. Sahn, MD, FASE

he echo community is mourning the loss of ASE Past President, David Sahn, MD, FASE, who passed away December 31, 2021. Dr. Sahn was a pioneer in echocardiography and Doppler ultrasound, performing the first real-time 2D echocardiogram in the United States in 1972. He was a mentor to many, received numerous honors and awards, and authored five books and hundreds of peer-reviewed publications, just to list a few of his accomplishments. He leaves behind a great legacy and will be missed deeply.
