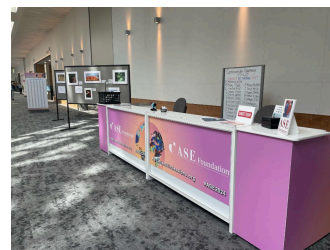

ASEF at ASE 2024

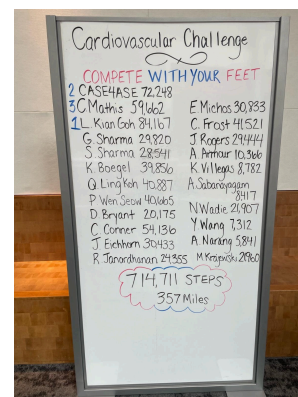

us closer to our \$230,000 Annual Appeal goal. More highlights from the weekend are listed below.



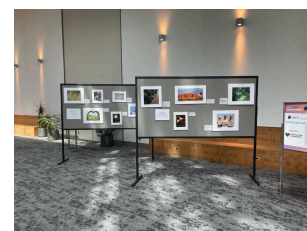
Cardiovascular Challenge
