Early-Career Development Grants Available for Echo Scientists Apply Today

The application is open for the 2025 <u>Early-Career</u> <u>Development Grant for Echo Scientists (EDGES)</u>. This annual funding opportunity awards three grants worth up to \$25,000 USD to fund projects that address a clinical gap in cardiovascular ultrasound imaging through research led by an early career scientist. There are no specific research themes that will be prioritized, and clinical gaps may include, but are not limited to: new imaging technologies, novel approaches or populations for diagnostic imaging, ultrasound therapy, workflow automation, or patient/practitioner safety. Physicians, PhDs,



veterinarians, sonographers, and other healthcare professionals who are within seven years from completing their training are eligible to **apply now through June 16, 2025**. The principal investigator must be an active ASE member.
