Four investigators will present their research to a panel of experts, and a winner will be selected and awarded \$1,500. The winner is then invited to present their research at the upcoming European Association of Cardiovascular Imaging's EuroEcho-Imaging meeting, and the Japanese Society of Echocardiography's Annual Scientific Meeting the following spring.
